Philosophy Statement

At Grace United Methodist Preschool, it is our desire to provide a safe and nurturing environment that will promote the physical, spiritual, social, emotional and cognitive development of the children in our care. Our intent is to facilitate a program that is developmentally appropriate for each child.

Our classrooms are designed to provide educational learning experiences that are at the age and stage of your child's development. Incorporated into the daily schedule and curriculum are weekly themes. While being introduced to various topics, children explore by hands-on experiences within the classroom during center and circle times.

The learning opportunities for young children are endless. It may seem as though they are just playing, but in reality they are developing and polishing many skills needed for formal education. The teacher's role is to scaffold each child's learning experiences. We continuously provide curriculum that fits each individual child's current level of performance while encouraging developmental achievements. Both child and teacher-directed PLAY are essential components of our curriculum. It is through this vehicle that mental growth, creativity and social skills are stimulated.

We encourage children to develop a strong positive attitude and self-esteem. By enabling children and providing age-appropriate learning opportunities, our environment allows children the freedom they need to move throughout the classroom and focus on their area of interest. Centers provide manipulatives that challenge their abilities and previously -learned knowledge. Throughout the year, we observe children organizing and making connections.

In conclusion, one of the most vital and necessary skills that preschool-age children should be developing is his/her ability to function with their peers and other adults. It is within this accomplishment, that the child can grow as a whole person.

Incorporated into all lessons are the basic fundamentals of learning:

- ◆ Language and Cognitive Thinking, Skills and Concepts
- ◆ Perception
- ◆ Gross and fine motor skills
- ◆ Auditory, visual and kinesthetic senses
- ◆ Christian education
- ◆ Art and music
- ◆ Science
- ◆ Pre-math
- ◆ Self-help skills
- ◆ Social and emotional development

These concepts will be taught through the following methods:

- ◆ Problem solving
- ◆ Critical thinking
- ◆ Logic
- ◆ Investigating
- ◆ Exploring

Our observation clearly indicates that children absorb information, process and organize this information, and then have a unique ability to convey their learning back to us in a way that makes sense to them.

Social and Emotional Development

One of the ways that we show respect for children is by enhancing their development opportunities. By investing in their development, we are signaling that we believe in them and see them as capable and competent. It is tempting to focus on easily-recognized academic skills, but the importance of social and emotional development cannot be underestimated.

Play

By playing, children learn and develop as individuals. Some children prefer to spend most of their time with creative play, some with imaginative play and others with active play. A balanced diet of play is best for development. It is good for your child to play in lots of different ways.

Our Program

Twos - Two-year olds are terrific learners. They are beginning to understand group play and become better at communicating their thoughts. With our twos, we emphasize language development to help children turn their ideas into words and sentences. Children will also have plenty of group activities to practice social skills, such as cooperation, sharing and taking turns.

Threes - A preschooler's world opens up in new ways as children improve coordination, learn complex games, and begin to interact more with their peers. In our three-year-old program, we will introduce language, math, science, and social skills in a logical, natural sequence to encourage learning one step at a time. Our teachers also provide plenty of individual attention to support your child's unique needs. Our programs provide a rich classroom environment where children are encouraged to explore and are challenged to learn, while making friends and developing self-confidence. We all know that children learn best by doing. So we provide opportunities for hands-on experiences, such as making collages, which combines creative expression and a tactile experience.

VPK - VPK is a critical time for children as they begin the adventure of a lifetime of learning. Our VPK program promotes independence while preparing your child for the next exciting phase - KINDERGARTEN!!! We make the transition smoother by helping children become more familiar with an organized environment. We focus on group play to develop social skills such as listening, sharing and cooperation. Our teachers have a passion for what they do, and consider it a privilege to partner with you during this special time in your child's life.

Dedicated Staff

Grace United Methodist Preschool has high standards, in which we carefully screen and select candidates who will teach your children. All teachers comply with the Grace United Methodist Preschool Child Protection and Safety Policy. We have assembled a staff of sensitive, loving and caring professionals that encourage continued growth and development for your children.

Each member of our staff is required to complete and certify themselves in First Aid and Infant/Child CPR. In addition to holding a CDA or higher degree, it is mandated by Environmental Health to obtain State Certification on Rules and Regulations, Child Abuse and Neglect, the Ages and Stages of Child Development and Health/Nutrition. In addition to meeting these requirements, continuing education is mandatory for our teachers. This ensures they have proper up-to-date training and the ability to implement age-appropriate curriculum within the classroom.

Families

Grace United Methodist Preschool encourages parent participation. It is an important aspect of a children's educational experience and provides them with the knowledge and understanding of others' unique abilities.

Through our "OPEN DOOR" policy, parents are invited to join and participate daily. This is a great way to promote educational and enriching opportunities within our classrooms. Sharing a cultural tradition, favorite childhood story or demonstrating a cooking activity will provide wonderful educational learning experiences for our children. We invite you to use your talents and be involved in your child's early development. After all, we are a community working together to provide and instill life experiences in our children.

Statement of Non-Discrimination

Grace United Methodist Preschool does not discriminate in providing services to children and their families, qualified applicants, nor its employees on the basis of race, religion, cultural heritage, political beliefs, sex, age or marital status. Our employment practices and school policies are consistent with the American's With Disabilities Act. Grace enrolls children of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students of this program.

Discipline

Prevention, redirection and positive encouragement are key when dealing with children in behavioral situations.

- ❖ We encourage children to use their words and work out conflict situations amongst themselves.
- ❖ When needed, teachers or the Director will step in and help resolve conflict.
- ❖ "Time Out" or "Quiet Time" is used only after the above is attempted.

Teachers have a unique ability to observe children and will do their best to ensure their safety. No child will be allowed to harm another in any way. Discipline will be respectful and within appropriate, developmental expectations.

Our policy will consist of gentle reminders, redirection and quiet time, if needed. If your child's behavior makes it impossible for teaching and learning to continue, you will be notified. If appropriate, a conference will be scheduled and a behavior strategy will be implemented. Suspension or expulsion could occur if any harmful behavior happens consistently.

In accordance with state rules, the following WILL NOT be used:

- ❖ Severe humiliating or frightening discipline
- ❖ Discipline associated with food
- ❖ Spanking or any other form of physical punishment

VPK Requirements

As you may know, VPK is funded by the state and has very strict guidelines that we must follow in order to comply with their regulations. Please read these requirements carefully and comply with them closely.

* Attendance requirements for VPK are 80/20. Which means your child needs to attend class 80% of the month and 80% of the total school year which is 540 hours. Grace preschool reserves the right to dismiss a child from VPK due to excessive absences within a month's time. If your child is in VPK please call the office to let us know they are home sick. That number is **452-4484**

Tuition Policy

Our Tuition Fees are calculated on a 10 month payment schedule and are due for each child at the beginning of the month. Written or verbal notice shall be given if payment is not received by the 10th of the month. An additional fee may be charged when tuition is past due.

Since our costs remain consistent for salaries and operational expenses, no deductions in tuition can be made for days a child does not attend school, whether for illness, vacation or school holidays. Grace United Methodist Church offers a Scholarship program on an as-need basis. If you need further information on this program, please contact the Director.

School Calendar

We follow the Brevard County Public School calendar closely. Due to unexpected changes in the public school calendar, our calendar is also subject to change throughout the school year. Please note for any nature emergencies such as hurricanes or climatic weather please listen to local news and if Brevard County closes the schools we will be closed as well. We will follow that same schedule they do for openings and closings...

Hours of Operation

Our Preschool hours of operation will be as follows:

- ❖ Before Care Hours: 7:30 am - 9:00 am (check registration and fee schedule)
- ❖ Preschool Hours: 9:00 am - 12:00 noon (check registration and fee schedule)
- ❖ Lunch Bunch: 12:00 noon - 2:00pm (check registration and fee schedule)

Please pick up your child each day, on time to ensure that our schedule each day is not disrupted and our classrooms run smoothly. There is a late fee of \$5.00 for every 5 minutes that you are late picking up your child.

*Wrap around Services: Before Care, and Lunch Bunch are provided by Grace to help with extended care times that you might need for your child (ren). The Before-Care hours and Lunch Bunch hours noted above will all be charged by the day. The fee for Before Care is \$5.00 per morning, and the fee for Lunch Bunch is \$10.00 from 12:00 - 2:00. For Before Care and Lunch Bunch you will need to buy a "ticket" from the office. The Director will put your child's name on the ticket(s) you buy and will give them to your child's teacher. At drop off, you will tell the teacher that your child is staying for Lunch Bunch. The teacher will let the parent know when they are running low on Lunch Bunch tickets.

Lunch Bunch

Lunch Bunch is from 12:00 pm - 2:00 pm and will take place in the child's classroom with their teachers. They will eat together in the classroom. The teacher will use this time to discuss health topics and manners with your child(ren). Lunch is provided by you, the parent. (Remember to label lunch boxes and/or sippy cups.) Lunch Bunch tickets, at a cost of \$10.00, are to be purchased in the office. Teachers will keep the tickets and write the date on the back of the ticket when the child stays for lunch. Remember: when staying for "Lunch Bunch", you will need to provide your child with their own lunch and drink. Please do not send foods that require heating or refrigeration. Environmental Health does not permit the use of microwave ovens. May we suggest foods that your child can feed him or herself. There will be a one time \$50.00 registration fee for VPK children who are using our Lunch Bunch program.

Chapel/Music

As a way to start each week, our children will be involved in Chapel and Music time that is lead by our Children's Ministry Director and Music teacher here at Grace. This will be a time where we can talk about Jesus and sing songs and honor God. Chapel time is open to all families who would like to come and worship with us.

Nutrition

Grace believes in instilling good nutrition habits for children. You will provide a morning snack and an afternoon snack for those children who will be staying for After Care. Snacks need to be individually-wrapped. A few of the choices may be Teddy Grahams, Animal Crackers, Gold Fish Crackers, or Saltines. Preschoolers are provided with water. **FOOD ALLERGIES must be in writing from a Doctor and given to the Director. These will be posted throughout the school to ensure all staff are aware of any allergy a child may have.**

Arrival and Departure Procedures

Your child's safety is our primary concern. With your cooperation and with the policies below, we hope that you will feel assured when leaving your child with us. At drop off, we ask that each child be brought to the door of their classroom at the beginning of the day so that their teacher can personally greet them and sign them into the classroom.

At dismissal time, we will never release your child to anyone unless we are sure of the identity of the person. All children are to be picked up from their classrooms. Those persons picking up your child/children should be prepared to present ID and need to be authorized to pick up the child on the enrollment form. The child will only be released as long as you have notified the Director/Assistant Director and/or the Teacher. A parent who has sole custody must inform the director and provide certification of the matter. It is the teacher's job to make sure that parents sign in and out their children as they enter and leave the classroom each day. Always make sure that you sign your child out everyday before you take them from the classroom, special program or event. For the safety of all, to reinforce our classroom procedures, please monitor your child in the hallways to ensure they use walking feet and are respectful of the artwork in our halls and other items that may be on display. Also when your child is here playing on our "Front Lawn" before or after school please remember that these rules also apply.

We love to see your children playing however we ask that you remember the following rules:

- 1) The child is in "parents care" and they need to be watched at all times
- 2) Please, No rough housing in the grass; mean tackling or wrestling
- 3) Please, No climbing the trees and benches around the Fellowship Hall we would hate to have your child fall
- 4) Please, No playing around the shed
- 5) Please, No jumping from the picnic tables
- 6) Please, NO PLAYING IN THE BUSHES
- 7) Please do Not let your child climb the fence
- 8) If your child needs to use the restroom or get a drink; they **MUST** have a parent bring them back into the building.

Thank you for helping us with this. We just would hate for anything to happen to your child/children. We want them to be safe while they are here with on the church/preschool campus.

Confidentiality Policy

Due to confidentiality, teachers and parents will discuss student progress or daily behavior privately. Therefore, hallway and/or classroom discussions during preschool hours will not be allowed unless a time and private location are established between the parent and teacher. Please contact your child's teacher to set up a conference time and location.

Illness

Please do not send your child to school if they are not well enough to fully participate. A sick child risks exposing others to illness. No child should come to school who has had signs of illness within 24 hours before their class day. Please note: preschool staff does not dispense any medication or non-prescription medication.

We will not accept a child with:

- ◆ Fever
- ◆ Vomiting
- ◆ Diarrhea
- ◆ White, yellow or green runny nose
- ◆ Cough
- ◆ Strep-throat (**They are still contagious until they have been on antibiotics for 48 hours!**)
- ◆ Impetigo (skin infection)
- ◆ Rashes with fever
- ◆ Head lice
- ◆ Thrush
- ◆ Inflamed eyes
- ◆ Chicken Pox
- ◆ Earache

If your child becomes sick while at school, he/she will be isolated from others, and you will be immediately notified to pick them up.

Please also make sure that you have read and signed off on the Influenza Virus information that is enclosed in your Packet. This information is provided to us from the Department of Children and families and is required to be in your child's file.

Accidents/First Aid

All injuries and incidents will be reported to the parent on the Accident Report form provided by Environmental Health. Out of respect and confidentiality, we do not name children involved in the accident or incident. The person supervising the children during the time of the accident will complete, date and sign the form. This form does require a parent signature. The Director will initial the report to ensure parents are properly notified. First Aid will be administered to minor cuts and bruises.

Please remember it is critical that your Emergency Contact information stay up-to-date to ensure speedy notification for serious accidents or illness. If your personal information changes or those named in the Emergency Contact portion of your enrollment form changes, please make those changes in the office with the Director and with your child's teacher. Note: Most of our Preschool staff has been certified in CPR and First Aid training.

Clothing

Children are encouraged to wear casual, comfortable, and washable clothing. They will be involved in many activities, some of which will be messy. We suggest clothing with elastic waistbands and easy fasteners and sturdy rubber-soled shoes. Please, no flip-flop sandals, Healy's or Crocs should be worn for your child's safety here at school. Children use the playground everyday, so please dress your child appropriately for the weather. You may want to apply sunscreen or bug repellent on your child at home before coming to school. All children must have a complete change of clothes in their cubbies for "life's emergencies". We ask you to label all items of clothing and place them in a zip-loc bag. Please do not allow your child to bring personal items which could be lost or damaged.

Diapering And Toileting Procedures For Two Year Olds

Diapering:

- ◆ Diapers are changed when soiled or wet and according to the schedule for the group. (Parent provided)
- ◆ Disposable wipes are used as each child is changed (Parent provided)
- ◆ Teachers and children's hands must be washed after each changing. Children will practice using paper towels to dry their hands and turning off the faucet.
- ◆ Diaper changing area may not be used for any other purpose. The changing table must be cleaned with disinfectant after each use.
- ◆ Clothing, blankets or linens soiled by feces, urine, vomit or blood will be cleaned to the best of our ability, and placed in a double plastic bag to take home at the end of the day.
- ◆ Disposable diapers must be put in a double plastic bag and thrown away.
- ◆ A change of clothing must be available for each child and must be provided by the parent. Please make sure all clothing is properly labeled with your child's name.

Toilet Training:

- ◆ Children are toilet trained in accordance with the request of their parents and in a manner consistent with their physical and emotional abilities.
- ◆ Children will not be punished for soiling or wetting their diaper or for not using the toilet, nor will they be coerced into toilet training.
- ◆ Children will be supervised during toilet training.
- ◆ Children and TEACHERS MUST WASH HANDS AFTER TOILETING. Soap and running water must be used, as well as paper towels.
- ◆ Soiled clothing and diapers must be taken care of as described above.
- ◆ Change of clothing, or school-owned clothing, must be available and laundered if used.

**3 year olds need to be potty trained before the beginning of the school year.
No pull ups or diapers for 3 year olds.**

Celebrations

Holidays will be celebrated throughout the year. Parents are invited to come and participate in the fun. Sign-up sheets will be posted in your child's class for party donations. We ask you send nutritious drinks and snacks as well as "treats" too! (Please No Red Drinks) We encourage you to celebrate with your child's class in honor of their birthday.

Note: If your child is having a Birthday party outside of the school, and you wish to pass out invitations, please make sure there are enough for the entire classroom. If not inviting the entire class, please mail invitations to each home.

Field Trip Policies

- Each parent will be given a permission slip for each field trip. It will be signed and sent to the child's teacher by the due date.
- Each Parent will drive his/her own child to the field trip location. If the parent is unable to drive, it is his/her responsibility to arrange transportation to and from the field trip for the child. Please let the child's teacher know with whom the child will be riding.
- If a parent is unable to stay for the field trip, the parent may still drive the child to the location and leave the child in the teacher's supervision. * Then the parent will pick the child up at the end. Please let the teacher know in advance if this is what you will be doing.
- In the event of a car accident, while on a preschool field trip, the parent's personal insurance will be primary and the church's insurance will be secondary.
- **No Teacher will transport a child in his/her personal vehicle, due to the church's insurance policy.**

*Policies may vary for certain field trips. We will let you know far in advance as to what we will be doing for each field trip.

Severe Weather and Drills

As part of our Emergency Preparedness we practice fire and severe weather, drills on a monthly basis, so that your child will react in a calm and safe manner. In case of a hurricane alert, tornado warning or any emergency situation, listen to your radio. If for any reason Brevard County Schools are closed because of severe weather, Grace Preschool will also be closed. If severe weather occurs during preschool hours, the children will be kept safely in the Education and Administration building until it is safe for them to return to their classrooms.

Miscellaneous

1. Pets: There are times that their may be family pets at the preschool. Students love to share their pets with us and we love to have well behaved and immunized (if applicable) animal (s) here at school. On days of "special celebration" of your pets, you will have ample notice given by your child's teacher. If your child has allergies to any pets or animals; please make sure you tell your child's teacher and the office so that can be noted in your child's official file. If you pet has immunization records that are current and you are bringing them to school, make sure to provide a copy to your child's teacher or to the office.
2. Smoking: Pursuant to Chapter 386, F.S., Smoking is **PROHIBITED** within the child care facility, all outdoor areas, during field trips and in vehicles being used to transport children
